<a href="#"><u>College JumpStart Scholarship</u></a>	October 17 <sup>th</sup>	\$1,000	Open to 10 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> graders and current college students. Write a short personal statement about your educational goals, how you will achieve these goals with the scholarship, or a time that hard work paid off for you.
<a href="#"><u>Courage to Grow</u></a>	October 31 <sup>st</sup> (And the last day of every month)	\$500	Scholarship for high school juniors or seniors with a GPA of 2.5 or higher. Awards are given out every month.
<a href="#"><u>Unigo Zombie Apocalypse Scholarship</u></a>	October 31 <sup>st</sup>	\$2,000	Hone your survival tactics and imagine what your school or college campus might be like in a zombie apocalypse. Our committee wants to know your plan to avoid the zombies, where you'd hide, and the top-five things you'd bring to stay alive. Write your plan in 250 words or less.
<a href="#"><u>Voice of Democracy Competition</u></a>	October 31 <sup>st</sup>	\$35,000	Express yourself in a democratic and patriotic-themed, recorded essay Write an essay and record yourself reading it out loud. 2023-24 theme: What are the greatest attributes of our democracy?
<a href="#"><u>Prudential Emerging Visionaries</u></a>	November 2 <sup>nd</sup>	\$15,000	A national recognition program that awards young people for their innovative solutions to financial and societal challenges in their communities. An Emerging Visionary is a changemaker – a young person with a bold vision for impact and a project to make it happen.

<a href="#"><u>Elk's Most Valuable Student</u></a>	November 13 <sup>th</sup>	\$1,000 – \$12,500/year	Scholarship for high school seniors planning on enrolling in a four-year college program. Applicants are judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.
<a href="#"><u>Haz U College Grant Program</u></a>	November 13 <sup>th</sup>	\$2,000 - \$15,000	Open to high school seniors with Hispanic heritage that have focused on academic excellence, dedicated service to their community, and demonstrated leadership.
<a href="#"><u>Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards</u></a>	November 13 <sup>th</sup>	\$3,500	Open to high school seniors with Hispanic heritage. Students received a grant either to fund their higher education or a community project.
<a href="#"><u>10 Words or Less Scholarship</u></a>	November 15 <sup>th</sup>	\$1,000	Open to students aged 14-25. In 10 words or less, why do you deserve this scholarship?
<a href="#"><u>JackKent Cooke Scholarship</u></a>	November 16 <sup>th</sup>	Up to \$55,000/year	The Cooke Foundation College Scholarship Program is the largest undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend the nation's best four-year colleges and universities. In addition to the monetary award, Cooke Scholars receive comprehensive educational advising, significant cohort-based programming, and graduate school funding, as well as a thriving network of nearly 3,000 fellow Cooke Scholars and alumni.

<a href="#"><u>Unigo Education Matters Scholarship</u></a>	November 30 <sup>th</sup>	\$5,000	While continuing your education takes time, and money, there's a certain value that everyone is hoping to achieve. Why does education matter to you? What is the value you hope to receive from college? Submit a written response (250 words or less) to the question: What would you say to someone who thinks education doesn't matter, or that college is a waste of time and money.
<a href="#"><u>AAUW Scholarship</u></a>	February 23 <sup>rd</sup>	\$4,000/year	The Scholarship Fund of the Minneapolis Branch was established to provide financial assistance to Minneapolis Public School women graduates to continue their education with the goal of attaining a Baccalaureate degree at an accredited institution. The selection criteria are based on grades, financial need, an essay written by the applicant, information from references, and an interview.

<a href="#"><u>Unigo Sweet and Simple Scholarship</u></a>	February 28 <sup>th</sup>	\$1,500	Think back to a time when you received a special gift that seemed unassuming yet made a strong impact in your life. Was it a present you could open in a box or a humble gesture from a stranger? In 250 words or less write about a time you received a gift and why it meant so much to you.

You'll graduate with a respected and secure career path as an Army Officer, and with less debt for the school years your scholarship covers. Recognizes students who are driving awareness and mobilizing youth to be catalysts for innovative models that provide solutions to eliminate hunger in the US.

<a href="#"><u>Burger King McLamore Foundation</u></a>	December 15 <sup>th</sup>	\$1,000 - \$50,000	Scholarship available for current high school seniors planning to attend college. Awards are selected based on GPA, work experience, extracurricular activities, and community service.

This scholarship recognizes students who show potential by demonstrating the qualities of leadership, determination and resilience as critical enablers of their future success.
<a href="#"><u>WTS Advancing Women Advancing Transportation</u></a>	January 3 <sup>rd</sup> , 2023	\$2,000	WTS fosters the development of women and girls in the transportation field by encouraging new professionals and students to pursue careers in transportation. One way it does this is by awarding a scholarship to high school girls interested in the field of transportation engineering, planning, or design.
<a href="#"><u>VSA International Young Soloists Award</u></a>	January 13 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,000	Open to U.S. and international young musicians with disabilities, either soloists or ensembles of any genre or instrument, including voice. Includes opportunities to participate in professional development and performance opportunities.
<a href="#"><u>Youth on Course College Scholarships</u></a>	January 17 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$4,000 - \$20,000 over 4 years	Open to high school seniors with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Scholarships are given out after an interview and are both need and merit based.
<a href="#"><u>APIA Scholarship Program</u></a>	January 19 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,500 - \$20,000	Program with a focus on supporting Asian and Pacific Islander students who live at or below the poverty line; are in the first generation of their family to attend college; are representative of the APIA community's diversity, (geographically and ethnically), especially those ethnicities that have been underrepresented on college campuses due to limited access and opportunity. Strong applicants would have an emphasis on community service and leadership.
<a href="#"><u>ExploraVision Awards</u></a>	January 31 <sup>st</sup>	\$10,000	A science competition for students of all interest, skill, and ability levels. Encourages students to combine their imaginations with the tools of science to create and explore a vision of future technology. Work in a group of two, three, or four, as well as a teacher as a team coach. Select a technology which is present in the home, school, community, or anything relevant to their lives. They will then explore what the technology does, how it works, and how, when, and why it was invented.
<a href="#"><u>KPMG Future Leaders Program</u></a>	January 31 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$10,000/year	The KPMG Future Leaders Program will award 22 deserving female high school seniors: a scholarship of \$10,000 per year for four years of college, a pairing with an executive woman mentor for one-year, and KPMG Future Leaders Retreat and ongoing KPMG support.



<a href="#"><u>PD Instore Scholarship</u></a>	February 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$10,000	The PD Instore Scholarship will provide funding to prospective post-secondary BIPOC students residing in Minnesota, interested in pursuing a career in production. Any BIPOC high school student in Minnesota may apply for this scholarship, but students focusing their career path on production/trades, including, but not limited to, Carpentry, Machine Operation, Logistics, Print Production, Project Management, 3D Design and Engineering are preferred.
<a href="#"><u>Davidson Fellows Scholarship</u></a>	February 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$50,000	Create a project or piece of work in the categories of Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Literature, Music, Philosophy, or Outside the Box.
<a href="#"><u>Hispanic Scholarship Fund</u></a>	February 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$500 - \$5,000	Open to high school seniors with Hispanic heritage that are planning to enroll in a public university the following year. In addition to the scholarship, this award includes career services, mentorship, leadership development, knowledge building, and wellness training, as well as access to internships and career opportunities.
<a href="#"><u>Minnesota Masonic Charities</u></a>	February 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,500 - \$6,000/year	A variety of scholarships with different criteria around academics, community service, and the type of school you are planning to attend.
<a href="#"><u>The Christopher's Poster Contest</u></a>	February 16 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$1,000	Create a poster interpreting the theme, "You Can Make a Difference". Illustrate the idea that one person can change the world for the better.
<a href="#"><u>Effie McKerson Book Scholarship</u></a>	February 20 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$500	This scholarship is to be awarded to a young woman for her efforts as a standout student. She must exude academic excellence and be active in her school and community. This scholarship is offered in the hope of assisting a determined young woman reach her academic and professional goals. To be eligible, applicants must be attending school in the Minneapolis/St. Paul Metro or surrounding areas. The award will be granted upon confirmation of registration in a college or university for summer or regular term of the fiscal year for which the scholarship is granted. A class schedule and a bursar's letter or receipt must be submitted by the applicant to the chapter. Women of color are strongly encouraged to apply.
<a href="#"><u>Chester E. and Marion D. Groth Scholarship</u></a>	February 24 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$3,500/year	Award for qualified students desiring to attend an institution to pursue careers in music education, performance, or music therapy.
<a href="#"><u>Richard and Louise Varco Scholarship Program</u></a>	February 24 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$5,000	The Saint Paul & Minnesota Foundation has established a scholarship program to assist high school seniors who plan to continue their education at an accredited college or vocational school in Minnesota.

<a href="#"><u>TheDream.US National Scholarships</u></a>	February 28 <sup>th</sup> , 2023 (24-25 Scholarship opens on November 1 <sup>st</sup> )	\$16,500 - \$33,000,	Open to undocumented immigrant students who came to the US before the age of 16 or before Nov. 1, 2017. This scholarship covers tuition and fees at one of their partner colleges.
<a href="#"><u>Youth Volunteer Scholarship</u></a>	February 28 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,000	Eligible applicants are high school students in any grade who have spent 20+ volunteering and impacting the lives of seniors (relative or non-relative) in a care center or within one's community. Volunteer hours may be spent the following ways: one-on-one visits, doing household chores, raking leaves, shoveling snow, grocery shopping, etc.
<a href="#"><u>Foundation 649 Scholarship</u></a>	March 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$1,000/year	Scholarship for young, talented Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who are actively elevating and serving their communities across the country. Students will write a short essay or other form of media (film, photography, etc.) sharing their story.
<a href="#"><u>Students of Integrity Scholarship</u></a>	March 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$2,500	Open to high school seniors. The BBB scholarship is primarily based on a written essay which must convey how the student has overcome a personal struggle or challenge by applying one or more of the UncommonSense principles.
<a href="#"><u>ELlevation Education Scholarship Program</u></a>	March 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 2023	\$2,000	Open to high school seniors who have received ELL services during their K-12 education. Scholarship recipients are selected based on academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, a statement of educational and career goals and objectives, and a signed recommendation letter from your ELL administrator or teacher on school district letterhead indicating dates of ELL program attendance. Financial need is not considered.
<a href="#"><u>Catch a Break</u></a>	March 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$11,000/year	A scholarship for Minnesota residents who have faced challenges in life, learned from them, and are enrolling in post-secondary education. Students will share challenges they have faced, and why they are motivated to receive a college education.
<a href="#"><u>Horatio Alger Association</u></a>	March 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,500	The Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need.



<a href="#"><u>William C. &amp; Corinne J. Dietrich Scholarship</u></a>	March 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$10,000	Scholarship available for any high school student in Minnesota. Scholarship recipients are selected based on academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances and an online recommendation.
<a href="#"><u>Allina Health Orthopedics Minnesota Athletes in Sports Medicine Scholarship</u></a>	March 18 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$2,500	Scholarship for high school seniors who have participated in athletics during high school and are planning to attend a 4-year university and study sports medicine. Qualified candidates should demonstrate leadership, be actively involved in their community and interscholastic sports and achieve academic success.
<a href="#"><u>MnACC BIPOC Student Scholarship</u></a>	March 24 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$1,000 - \$2,500	Open to high school seniors who identify as BIPOC. Write a 500–1000-word essay about Leadership & Community Engagement, Diversity, or what empowers you and what completing your degree would mean to you.
<a href="#"><u>Bridging the Dream Scholarship</u></a>	March 27 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	\$10,000	Open to current high school seniors who plan to enroll in a vocational, technical, certification, associate, or undergraduate program. Applicants should be “diverse,” encompassing race, ethnicity, gender, disability, and belonging to an underserved group.
<a href="#"><u>The Donohue Family SkillPointe Scholarship</u></a>	March 31 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$2,000	Scholarships are available to individuals of all backgrounds pursuing vocational training in industries such as construction, communications, energy, healthcare, manufacturing, public service, technology, and transportation.
<a href="#"><u>Lindsey Vonn Foundation Scholarship</u></a>	March 31 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$5,000	Showcase your ability to overcome obstacles, discover grit, and pursue a passion. This scholarship can be applied to any enrichment activity (camps, prep-classes, clubs) that help you engage in your passions.
<a href="#"><u>MGA Foundation Women's Scholarship</u></a>	March 31 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$3,000/year	Available to high school senior girls who intend to enroll in college the year they submit this application. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and live in Minnesota. Scholarship funds may be applied toward tuition, books, room and board. A scholarship recipient must be enrolled and continue as a full-time student at an accredited college or university.
<a href="#"><u>Vernetta Wilson Memorial Scholarship</u></a>	March 31 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$500 - \$1,500	The Vernetta Wilson Memorial Scholarship is for African American Twin Cities high school seniors who have demonstrated leadership skills and are active volunteers (30+ hours)
<a href="#"><u>Page Education Foundation Grant</u></a>	April 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2023	\$1,500 - \$2,500	Page Grants are awarded to Minnesota students of color who attend Minnesota post-secondary schools and agree to complete annual service projects with young

			children. The selection process highlights an applicant's attitude toward education, willingness to provide service to children, and financial need.
