Catch a Trade! Scholarship Program	TBD, likely similar to the above	\$11,000	For Minnesota students attending Minnesota technical colleges to study construction trades. They have 15 new scholarships available each year. All scholarships are renewable, up to \$11,000 per year, up to four years.

<u>Horatio Alger Career & Technical Education Scholarship</u>	Opens Dec 1 st Juniors: Ends 3/1/27 Seniors: Ends 2/15/27	\$25,000 (National scholarship) \$20,000 (Hormel Foundation)	For current high school juniors and seniors planning to pursue a bachelor's degree. Also offered: scholarships for high school seniors who are planning to enroll in an associate's degree, certificate, or diploma program in the fall.
<u>Unigo Do-Over Scholarship</u>	June 30 th	\$1,500	Mistakes – we've all made them. Too bad life doesn't always give you a mulligan. Or does it? What if you had the chance to "do-over" a moment in your life? What would it be? How would it affect you and your future? Write a response to the question, if you could get one "do-over" in life, what would it be and why? (250 words or less)

Students should be graduating high school seniors from: Humboldt High School, Guadalupe Area Program, Edison High School, Southwest High School, Harding High School, Two Rivers High School (aka. Henry Sibley), Richfield High School, Roosevelt High School, Washburn High School, Highland Park High School, The FAIR School, South St. Paul Secondary, St. Croix Lutheran Academy, Minneapolis South High School, Takoda Prep, or El Colegio Charter School.
<u>Award for Aspirations in Computing</u>	October 27 th	Varies	For students who identify as women, genderqueer, or non-binary. Celebrates achievements and interests in computing and encourages students to pursue their passions.
<u>Elk's Most Valuable Student</u>	November 12 th	\$1,000 – \$7,500/year	Scholarship for high school seniors planning on enrolling in a four-year college program. Applicants are judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.
<u>Haz U College Grant Program</u>	November 1 st	\$2,000 - \$10,000	Open to high school seniors with Hispanic heritage that have focused on academic excellence, dedicated service to their community, and demonstrated leadership.
<u>JackKent Cooke Scholarship</u>	November 11 th	Up to \$55,000/year	The Cooke Foundation College Scholarship Program is the largest undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend the nation's best four-year colleges and universities. In addition to the monetary award, Cooke Scholars receive comprehensive educational advising, significant cohort-based programming, and graduate school funding, as well as a thriving network of nearly 3,000 fellow Cooke Scholars and alumni.
<u>Dell Scholars Program</u>	February 15 th	\$20,000	Scholarship for high school seniors who have participated in a College Readiness Program (AVID, College Possible, GEAR UP, etc.) in their Junior and Senior years. In addition to the scholarship, students will receive access to personalized college support and a laptop.
<u>Ron Brown Scholar Program</u>	December 1 st	\$40,000	Scholarship for Black/African American current seniors in high school. Demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship,

			and global citizenship. Write two 500-word essays; one answering a specific question, and one that you submitted to apply for college.
<u>Point Foundation Flagship Scholarship</u>	November 19 th	Up to \$15,000 based on financial need	The Point Foundation Flagship Scholarship empowers LGBTQ students who are earning their undergraduate, graduate, & doctoral degrees at accredited colleges in the United States by offering financial support, community resources, and professional development.
<u>Burger King McLamore Foundation</u>	Open: Oct 15 Closes: Dec 15	\$1,000 - \$60,000	Scholarship available for current high school seniors planning to attend college. Awards are selected based on GPA, work experience, extracurricular activities, and community service.
<u>Students of Integrity Scholarship</u>	Open: Oct 6 Closes: Nov 17	\$2,500	Open to high school seniors. The BBB scholarship is primarily based on a written essay which must convey how the student has overcome a personal struggle or challenge by applying one or more of the Uncommon Sense principles.
<u>APIA Scholarship Program</u>	Open: Nov 15 Closes: Jan 15	\$2,500 - \$20,000	Program with a focus on supporting Asian and Pacific Islander students who live at or below the poverty line; are in the first generation of their family to attend college; are representative of the APIA community's diversity, (geographically and ethnically), especially those ethnicities that have been underrepresented on college campuses due to limited access and opportunity. Strong applicants would have an emphasis on community service and leadership.
<u>The Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship</u>	January 14 th + Spring interviews	Up to \$30,000 over 4 years	A scholarship for graduating seniors planning to attend a 4-year institution. This scholarship provides a multi-faceted experience designed to not only address the financial needs of students who aspire to attend college but to guide them through the process of higher education.
<u>John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest</u>	January 11 th	\$10,000	Describe and analyze an act of political courage by a US elected official who served during or after 1917. Include an analysis of the obstacles, risks, and consequences associated with the act. The essay may concern an issue at the local, state, national, or international level. Write an essay between 700-1,000 words. Use at least five varied sources such as government documents, letter, newspaper articles, book, and/or personal interviews.
<u>VSA International Young Soloists Award</u>	November 19 th	\$2,500	Open to U.S. and international young musicians with disabilities, either soloists or ensembles of any genre or instrument, including voice. Includes opportunities to participate in professional development and performance opportunities.

<u>ExploraVision Awards</u>	January 27 th	\$10,000	A science competition for students of all interests, skills, and ability levels. Encourages students to combine their imaginations with the tools of science to create and explore a vision of future technology. Work in a group of two, three, or four, as well as a teacher as a team coach. They will examine a technology which is present in the home, school, community, or anything relevant to their lives.
<u>Wallin Education Partners</u>	2-year program open Feb12-April 23 4-year program open Nov 1-Jan 27	\$16,000 (\$4,000/year)	Scholarship for graduating seniors who are attending either a 2-year or 4-year public or private institution in Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, or any HBCU. Students should have a minimum 3.0 GPA and demonstrated financial need. This scholarship includes access to individualized advising, and career/internship resources.
<u>Point Foundation Community College Scholarship</u>	Open in January 2027	\$4,800	The Point Foundation Community College Scholarship empowers LGBTQ students who are earning their associate degree or intend to transfer to a four-year college or university in the United States by offering financial support, community resources, and professional development.
<u>TheDream.US National Scholarships</u>	Opens November 1	\$16,500 - \$33,000,	Open to undocumented immigrant students who came to the US before the age of 16 or before Nov. 1, 2017. This scholarship covers tuition and fees at one of their partner colleges.
<u>Point Foundation BIPOC Scholarship</u>	October 22 nd	\$1,500	The Point Foundation BIPOC Scholarship aims to mitigate generations of racism and an education system born from discriminatory policies by providing financial support, community resources, and professional development to LGBTQ students who identify as Black, Indigenous, and People of Color.
<u>Horatio Alger Undergraduate Scholarship</u>	Open Dec 1 st	Up to \$25,000	The Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need.
<u>MnACC BIPOC Student Scholarship</u>	Available from March-May 1 st	\$1,500	Open to high school seniors who identify as BIPOC. Write a 500–1000-word essay about Leadership & Community Engagement, Diversity, or what empowers you and what completing your degree would mean to you.
<u>The Minnesota Association for Korean Americans</u>	September 30 th	\$1500	A scholarship for Minnesota high school seniors of Korean origin/heritage who plan to pursue a higher education. Write a 2–3-page essay about what it means to be Korean American in Minnesota.

<u>Latino Scholarship Fund</u>	May 17th	\$5000	Latino entrepreneurs, community leaders, foundations and local businesses have come together to develop a scholarship fund to support talented Latino students who aspire to build their future through higher education.
<u>The Gates Scholarship</u>	September 15 th	Full cost of attendance!	A highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for outstanding, minority, high school seniors from low-income households. Each year, the scholarship is awarded to exceptional student leaders, with the intent of helping them realize their maximum potential.
<u>McDonald's Black and Positively Golden Scholarship</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$15,000	Open to students planning to attend an HBCU during the 2024-2025 academic year. Students should have demonstrated leadership abilities and financial need. Students will submit a professional image with their school logo and create a video answering how their education can empower them to achieve Black Excellence.
<u>Equitable Excellence Scholarship</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$20,000	Open to high school seniors planning on attending a 2-year or 4-year school after graduation. This scholarship recognizes students who show potential by demonstrating the qualities of leadership, determination and resilience as critical enablers of their future success.
<u>WTS Advancing Women Advancing Transportation</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$2,000	WTS fosters the development of women and girls in the transportation field by encouraging new professionals and students to pursue careers in transportation. One way it does this is by awarding a scholarship to high school girls interested in the field of transportation engineering, planning, or design.
<u>Youth on Course Scholarships</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$4,000 - \$20,000	Open to high school seniors with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Scholarships are given out after an interview and are both need and merit based.
<u>Davidson Fellows Scholarship</u>	Opens Fall '26	\$25,000 - \$100,000	Create a project or piece of work in the categories of Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Literature, Music, Philosophy, or Outside the Box.
<u>Hispanic Scholarship Fund</u>	Opens January 5 th Closes February 15 th	\$500 - \$5,000	Open to high school seniors with Hispanic heritage that are planning to enroll in a public university the following year. In addition to the scholarship, this award includes career services, mentorship, leadership development, knowledge building, and wellness training, as well as access to internships and career opportunities.

<u>Richard and Louise Varco Scholarship Program</u>	February	\$5,000	The Saint Paul & Minnesota Foundation has established a scholarship program to assist high school seniors who plan to continue their education at an accredited college or vocational school in Minnesota.
<u>AKADPO Scholarship</u>	Open in January	\$500 - \$2,000	Open to high school seniors who are African American or of African descent. Submit an essay and resume demonstrating leadership and community service.
<u>Foundation 649 Scholarship</u>	March 1 st 2026	\$1,000/year	Scholarship for young, talented Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who are actively elevating and serving their communities across the country. Students will write a short essay or other form of media (film, photography, etc.) sharing their story.
<u>The Links Inc. Scholarship</u>	April 20 th 2026	\$1,000 - \$3,000	Open to high school seniors of African American descent. Students should plan to enter a 2–4-year school in the fall. Apply and share a personal statement about yourself and your academic and career goals.
<u>William C. & Corinne J. Dietrich Scholarship</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$10,000	Scholarship available for any high school student in Minnesota. Scholarship recipients are selected based on academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances and an online recommendation.
<u>The Donohue Family SkillPointe Scholarship</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$2,000	Scholarships are available to individuals of all backgrounds pursuing vocational training in industries such as construction, communications, energy, healthcare, manufacturing, public service, technology, and transportation.
<u>MGA Foundation Women's Scholarship</u>	Open in Oct	\$3,000/year	Available to high school senior girls who intend to enroll in college the year they submit this application. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and live in Minnesota. Scholarship funds may be applied toward tuition, books, room and board. A scholarship recipient must be enrolled and continue as a full-time student at an accredited college or university. Golf Interest.
<u>AFSA and USIP National High School Essay Contest</u>	Open in Oct	\$2,500 + All expenses paid voyage with Semester at Sea	Research international issues and write an essay about a topic of global significance and the key role that diplomacy can play in connecting people and ideas. Past themes have included "Partnerships for Peace in a Multipolar Era", "Diplomats & Peacebuilder", and "Why Diplomacy and Peacebuilding Matter".
<u>Page Education Foundation Grant</u>	Open in April	\$1,500 - \$2,500	Page Grants are awarded to Minnesota students of color who attend Minnesota post-secondary schools and agree to complete annual service projects with young

			children. The selection process highlights an applicant's attitude toward education, willingness to provide service to children, and financial need.
<u>Kao Kalia Yang Scholarship Program</u>	Open in December	\$5,000/year	Scholarship for high school seniors who are blood descendants of Hmong race or ethnically identify as Hmong American. Students should have a household income at or below the Federal Low-Income Level and take part in an online interview if chosen as a finalist.
<u>Village Scholars</u>	Open in February	\$5,000/year	The Village Scholars scholarship seeks to foster the creative endeavors of graduating Minneapolis high school students by offering a recurring \$5,000 scholarship to students interested in pursuing an education and career in a creative field. Essay required describing how the arts have impacted the student's life and how the scholarship would help them achieve their goals of pursuing an education/career in the arts.
<u>EMPOWER Scholarships</u>	Closed April 20 th	\$1,500	The EMPOWER (Encourage Minority Participation in Occupations with Emphasis on Rehabilitation) Scholarship, administered by the Courage Kenny Rehabilitation Institute encourages and supports ethnically diverse students who are pursuing a career in a medical or rehabilitation field.
<u>Melvin and Sally Mooty Scholarship</u>	Closed April 30 th	Up to \$5,000	The program is intended to assist people who have a sensory impairment or physical disability who want to pursue educational goals or gain technical expertise beyond high school. Applicants will need to identify how a scholarship will support their educational aspirations and career goals. Selection emphasis is placed on the applicants' intentions and achievements rather than solely on their graduation ranking.
<u>Barbara Mandigo Kelly Peace Poetry Awards</u>	Closed July 1 st	\$200	Poetry has a way of moving us past facts and immersing us into an experience. Submit your own original poetry that explores positive visions of peace and the human spirit.
<u>CEW IV Foundation Scholarship Program</u>	Closed July 29 th	\$500	Open to BIPOC high school seniors with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Demonstrate academic merit and financial need, and submit an essay regarding how the recent social justice movement has impacted you or those around you?
<u>Unigo Make Me Laugh Scholarship</u>	Closed August 31 st	\$1,500	We don't want to know why you deserve \$1,500 or how great your grades are, we simply want to LOL. Write and describe an incident in your life, funny or embarrassing (fact or fiction), and make us laugh! (250 words or less)

<u>Unigo All About Education Scholarship</u>	Closed, check back next year	\$3,000	Open to all high school students. In 250 words or less, answer the question, "How will a \$3,000 scholarship for education make a difference in your life?"
<u>Lindsey Vonn Foundation Scholarship</u>	October 31 st	Up to \$5,000	Showcase your ability to overcome obstacles, discover grit, and pursue a passion. This scholarship can be applied to any enrichment activity (camps, prep-classes, clubs) that help you engage in your passions.
<u>SchoolHouse Connection Scholarship</u>	Opens Jan 4 th	\$2,500 + paid trip to DC	Open to students who are attending college for the first time in 2023 who have experienced homelessness in the last 6 years. Write 3 essays and submit a letter of recommendation.
<u>Chester E. and Marion D. Groth Scholarship</u>	February 16 th	\$3,500/year	Awards annual post-secondary scholarships to qualified students desiring to pursue a degree in Music Education, Music Performance, or Music Therapy in the form of tuition scholarships. Finalists will attend an audition in March.
